JA Stock Market Challenge presented by Charles Schwab to take place March 14 & 15
High school students gain real-life experience with the world of Wall Street

(DENVER March 12, 2018) – Nearly 1,400 students from 33 area high schools will compete in the JA Stock Market Challenge on March 14 and 15 from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the Charles Schwab Campus Event Center (9899 Schwab Way, Lone Tree).

The JA Stock Market Challenge, presented by Charles Schwab, is a live stock market simulation game, featuring teams of high school students who compete to see who can grow their initial \$500,000 investment into the largest net worth “mock” stock portfolio. Students will apply what they have learned in the JA Take Stock in Your Future classroom lessons about individual equities, the impact of the economy, geopolitical events, and market sentiment, all against the backdrop of competing with their peers. The challenge offers a taste of what it’s like to build a portfolio, manage risk, and experience its performance in a compressed period of time.

“This is a fantastic exercise to pique students’ interest in the potential power of investing,” said Kent Clark, senior vice president of client services & support at Charles Schwab. “Exposing students to capital markets at an early age and learning the fundamentals of investing is an experience they will never forget. Likewise, the competition is thought-provoking and engaging for the students, as well as for our employees who help bring it to life.”
